OUTCOME (not less than 300 words):-

The AAAS conference was a five day program of seminars, lectures, networking opportunities and poster sessions. The conference was open to both undergraduate and post-graduate students as well as post-docs. There was a wide range of talks and seminars that we had the chance to go to. Moreover, a smaller conference was taking place at the same time. This was organised by the Triple Helix, which is a student run, non- profit organisation aimed at integrating science in society. It consists of three divisions: i) Science in Society Review, the international journal of science, society and law, ii) TTH Online blog and iii) Science Policy Division. There are twenty active chapters worldwide, including one at the University of Edinburgh. As the founding members of the Edinburgh chapter (President, Secretary, Treasurer), we are heavily involved in the running of the organisation so attending the annual conference and meeting members from other chapters was a great experience for us.

Our participation at the Chicago conference was of benefit, not only on a personal level but also to the Edinburgh University science student body as a whole. We are grateful for this rare opportunity we had to present real research in a real conference environment. Additionally, by representing the Edinburgh chapter of the 'Triple Helix' association our aim was to promote the whole of the Undergraduate student body at Edinburgh and raise the profile of Edinburgh within this global association.
