Sense about Science is an independent charity that promotes the public interest in sound science and evidence. Founded



Waverley Station to Chrystal Macmillan building by foot avoiding stairs:

- 1. Exit Waverley Station to Princes Street; continue right past the Balmoral hotel
- 2. Turn right to North Bridge; continue straight
- 3. Turn right at Nicolson Square Gardens; continue straight toward Potterrow
- 4. Turn left to Potterrow; continue straight toward Crichton St
- 5. Turn right to Crichton St; continue straight past George Square Gardens
- 6. Chrystal Macmillan Building is at the end of the street on the right

Public transport:
