

## Getting to the EASTBIO Health Thematic Meeting in Aberdeen (8<sup>th</sup> of December)

The event will be held in the Level 7 conference room at the Institute of Medical Sciences (IMS) at the Foresterhill Campus.

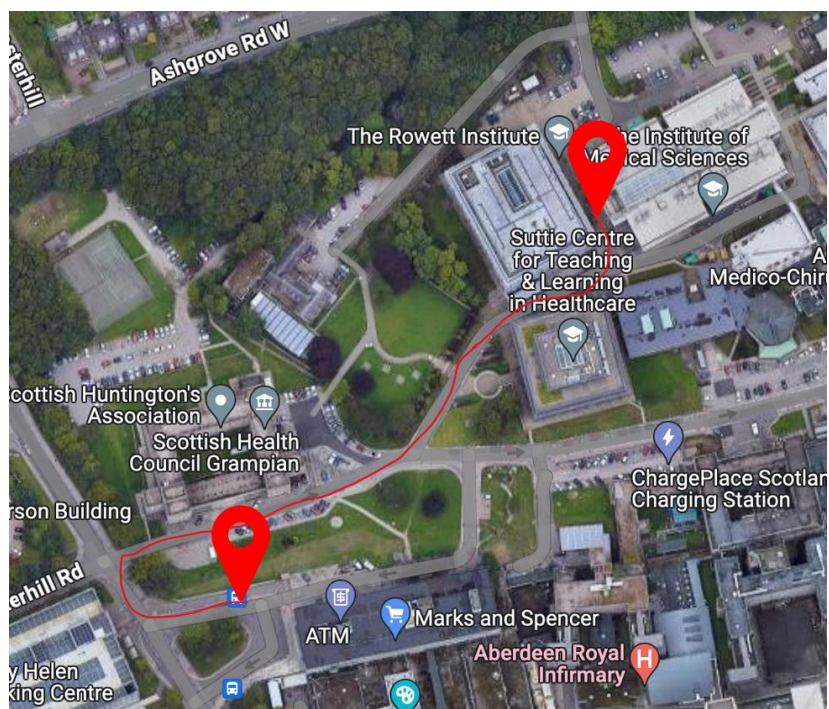
### Getting to the IMS

Both the bus and train station are located at Union Square. The easiest way to get to the venue is by taking the bus to Aberdeen Royal Infirmary (ARI).

- The number 9, 10 and 35 (Stagecoach) leave from Union Square Bus station every hour and take you to outside ARI.
- Alternatively, the number 3 (First Bus, Thistle line) and 59 (Stagecoach), which come every 15 minutes, leave from Guild Street (stop M3), situated to the front of Union Square, and stop outside ARI.

Student day tickets can be purchased on First buses or in the First Bus app for £4.30 with a valid student ID, or Stagecoach DayRider tickets can be purchased for £3.70 on the bus or in their app.

From the bus stop, it is a short 4-minute walk to the IMS as shown in the map.



## Arriving at the IMS

Entry to the IMS is restricted to Aberdeen University students and staff so requires entry via ID cards. One of the Aberdeen Health team will be on standby at the front door (the entrance opposite the Rowett Institute) to allow entry and direction to the conference room. If you have been held up and are running late, there should be a receptionist at the front door who we have informed of the event who will be able to let you in.

## Level 7 conference room

The Level 7 conference room is located on the 7<sup>th</sup> floor and is only accessible via the back two stairwells located at both sides of the building. After entering, take the first left and follow the corridor round to the back of the building where the stairway is located. The conference room can also be accessed by the lift located next to the stairway on the right side of the building.

## Accessibility and communication

We ask you please fill in the form with your personal details prior to the event so we can do our best to accommodate any requirements surrounding accessibility and communication, including the need of safe/quiet spaces and access to presentations in paper format. We also ask, if possible, for participants to bring their lanyard with their name and traffic light cards, given on the induction days, if they feel they might benefit from being able to indicate whether they wish to interact with other participants.
