Question 43 'I have felt able to manage my mental health'. This question was optional.


Respondents selected one option on a scale of 1 to 5, 1 representing 'Strongly disagree' to 5 representing 'Strongly agree'.

All Respondents

Of the 241 survey respondents, 4 skipped the question.

Of the 237 that answered the question:

- 58% (136 people) either agreed or strongly agreed that they felt able to manage their mental health.
 - 68 people agree that they could manage their mental health (4 on a scale of 1-5)
 - 68 people strongly agreed that they could manage their mental health (5 on a scale of 1-5)



Gender Breakdown

- The majority of women and men selected 'agree' or 'strongly agree' (61% of women and 54% of men). Women and men selected 'agree' or 'strongly agree' in similar proportions (women 30.5%, men 27%).
- 10% more men than women chose the middle option (3 out of 5).


• 4% more women chose 'disagree' than men. Women and men selected 'strongly disagree' in similar proportions (women 6%, men 7%).

Academic and Research Staff

Of 143 respondents that selected they were academic or research staff at Question 10, 4 people skipped the question.

Of the 139 that answered the question:



56% (78 people) either agreed or strongly agreed that they felt able to manage their mental health.

- 42 people agreed that they could manage their mental health (4 on a scale of 1-5)
- 36 people strongly agreed that they could manage their mental health (5 on a scale of 1-5)

39 were women (50%), 35 were men (45%), 4 (5%) identified another way or preferred not to select a binary gender.



23% (32 people) selected the middle option between agree and disagree in relation to managing their mental health.

12 were women (38%), 18 (56%) were men, 2 (6%) identified another way or preferred not to select a binary gender.



21% (29 people) strongly disagreed or disagreed that they felt able to manage their mental health

- 10 people strongly disagreed that they had felt able to manage their mental health (1 on a scale of 1-5)
- 19 people disagreed that they had felt able to manage their mental health (2 on a scale of 1-5)

15 (52%) were women, 11 (38%) were men, 3 (10%) identified another way or preferred not to select a binary gender.

Professional Services (including tutors and demonstrators – 2 people only)

Of the 75 respondents that selected they were academic or research staff at Question 10, no-one skipped Question 43 'I have felt able to manage my mental health'.

Of the 75 that answered the question:

- The majority of women and men selected 'agree' or 'strongly agree' (62% of women and 54% of men). Women and men selected 'agree' or 'strongly agree' in similar proportions (women 30.5%, men 27%).
- 10% more men than women chose the middle option (3 out of 5).
- 4% more women chose 'disagree' than men. Women and men selected 'strongly disagree' in similar proportions (women 6%, men 7%).

Technicians and Other Technical Roles

Of the 23 respondents that selected they were Technicians or other Technical roles. All answer the question.

- 64% of women and 42% of men selected 'agree' or 'strongly agree'.
- Men in this group (caution: small numbers) selected 'agree' or 'strongly agree' 12% less than respondents overall, men overall, or professional services/tutors and demonstrator men.
- 42% more men (caution: small numbers) than women chose the middle option (2 women, 5 men).
- No men selected disagree or strongly disagree. 3 women selected either disagree or strongly disagree.
